



This plan represents the Commissioner's commitment to Norfolk residents about how policing will be delivered as well as the provision of support for victims and crime prevention. In Norfolk, the Office of the PCC hosts the Community Safety Partnership, bringing together a network of local councils, policing, probation, youth offending, health and housing, all working together to improve safety in the county.

This is a plan for the people of Norfolk, developed with their input and designed to put safety and justice for all at the heart of

everything the constabulary and its partners do. People want policing that tackles the crimes that really impact communities. They are concerned about drugs, they want more to be done about speeding and dangerous driving and they want perpetrators of sexual assaults and domestic abuse brought to justice. Violence against women and girls is a huge concern throughout the country and more must be done to tackle it, in convictions and prevention.



People want a police service they can see and that they can trust. Building those feelings of confidence in Norfolk's communities goes hand in hand with demonstrating that our county has a police force to be proud of.

Challenges remain, but the Trust is determined to ensure that churches continue to be at the heart of communities throughout the UK and that their magnificent heritage is safeguarded for future generations.

Royal Norfolk Show June 29 & 30

This year's Show could be the "best for a generation" with the event's long-awaited comeback after two successive Covid cancellations. There will be three central themes: 'Homegrown', 'Local Living' and 'Farming Champions'.

Homegrown could mean produce, talent, business - anything you like reflecting the localism that has emerged strongly from the pandemic: people want to buy locally, particularly food produce. The Local Living and Farming Champions themes will combine in a new project called On The Map, aimed at linking schools with farms to boost understanding of how food is produced in Norfolk.

The Show coincides with the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, an occasion which will be celebrated with a Royal Salute featuring more than 1,000 local performers. The "mammoth performance" in the Grand Ring will include music, song and dance to celebrate her long reign,



and the heritage of the nation and Commonwealth. It also forms the centrepiece of the Royal Norfolk Agricultural Association's 175th anniversary celebrations.

Other show highlights include performances from hundreds of musicians - 'Homegrown' talent from schools and community bands. There will also be a large new agricultural machinery demonstration area including displays bringing farm machinery to life, including the latest in robotic technologies and automated drones. The show's traditional array of around trade stands and livestock competitions will return, along with a packed Grand Ring programme. Attractions confirmed so far include the Shetland Pony Grand National, and races of horse-drawn mail coaches.

It is hoped that information about local traffic measures will be included in the June edition of Grapevine.

Marlingford Village Hall Annual Report

As we move into a post-restriction era Marlingford Village Hall is gradually receiving more and more people and activities. As previously reported, during lockdown we took the opportunity to improve our facilities and make the area a more usable and pleasant space to be. This includes a new patio at the back of the hall with patio doors replacing one of the windows. This gives a large area across the entire rear of the hall with splendid views across the valley. As part of this work, we also added a new storage shed with a path between the shed and hall. This allows the tables and chairs to be stored outside the hall so that the whole of the internal space can be utilised.

The patio was officially opened when the hall hosted a Macmillan Coffee Morning in September, raising over £300 for the charity. It was fantastic to see so many people at the hall enjoying tea, coffee, and cakes in the open air. Many thanks to all of those that helped and baked the sumptuous cakes and cookies. Having the patio was also very useful on November 5th when we held a bonfire party with a small number of fireworks. Everyone who came along really enjoyed seeing the remains of the old shed being lit on a cold November evening.

We now host three art groups on Mondays, Thursdays, and Fridays all of which are benefiting from the new facilities in the brighter, less drafty hall. It is always a pleasure seeing the artwork that is hung on the walls.

Marlingford Movies and Talks are slowly starting to happen as well although we are finding that our audiences are not as large as pre-pandemic. We think that people are more used to the large multi national streaming services so we are looking to see if we can add value to films by having themed evenings.

Unfortunately, we have also had to cancel a couple of events in the last few months due to Covid outbreaks and we hope that this will be a reducing trend. The committee has a couple of new members, and we also have some new volunteers who are helping at events and general maintenance. We are now planning for more events during the summer and autumn, with a re-arranged Indian Night, the Queens' Platinum Jubilee Celebrations - see Mary's article below for more information - and a sale to raises funds for Marlingford Church - see page 17.

The committee is always grateful for the support received when holding events and the support that we get from the parish council and South Norfolk district council. Housing Developments

We are continuing to liaise with Persimmon and Orbit Homes over the details and delivery of their respective developments.

We are currently dealing with numerous significant breaches of planning conditions by Persimmon Homes on the first phase of their development. We are disappointed that South Norfolk District are unwilling to act and enforce over these serious breaches. We are considering our options to ensure the scheme is developed as stipulated by the planning conditions and complies with Planning Law.

We are also working with the developers and South Norfolk District Council over the implications of Natural England's updated Nutrient Neutrality guidance. This has the potential to delay further development while measures are agreed and put in place to mitigate against nitrate and phosphate pollutants entering the hydrological system.

I wonder if you are one of those people who have a tidy set of matching mugs or cups and saucers in your kitchen cupboard that are perfect for bringing out for visitors?
