

Beware of scammers pretending to be family

Colton resident Ann Dunn explains how she almost lost £500 to scammers in the hope that others won't get caught the same way.

My daughter is a busy and active woman and with so much going on in her life, she sometimes misplaces or loses things. So it came as no surprise to me to

get a WhatsApp message from her saying she had mislaid her phone. The chat went something like this: *C: Hiya mum*

Me: Oh hiya, is that you C? C: Yes, it's me. I've mislaid my phone and I'm using this one for now. Everything ok? Me: Yes fine. And you?

C: I'm OK, just a bit stressed. *Me:* Is it work?

C: No. I don't want to bother you with it but the bank has blocked my online banking for 48 hours because of this new number. I've got to pay the mortgage now so that's stressing me out. I'm contacting the bank now. Me: At least it's not work. C: But the problem is I have to make the payment today and I won't be able to do it myself. Do you think you could make the payment for me? I'll pay you back on Wednesday.



Well you can guess where this this conversation was leading. At no time during this chat did I doubt that the person I was talking to was my daughter. And of course, I wanted to help her out. I offered to pay the £500 directly into her account but she said it had to be paid directly into the mortgage company's account. She sent me the details and I made the transfer. Straightaway, my phone rang. It was my bank and I was told I'd just been scammed. At first, I thought that this was a scam call. I said, no, I was certain I hadn't been scammed and if they were calling about a transfer I had just made, I had just paid some money to help my daughter. They replied, "Did you check it was your daughter? Are you sure it was really her?" Then the

penny dropped. Talk about feeling like a complete and utter idiot!! Even worse, I have taught IT and computer science for most of my working life and one of the lessons taught was on security and how not to be scammed....

I was lucky in that the person who had scammed me was being monitored and the bank stopped the payment immediately, so the money never left my account. So be warned! You may not be so lucky if it happens to you. These fraudsters are getting more and more devious. Here are a few things to bear in mind: If someone you know contacts you or sends a link from an unknown number on WhatsApp, it could well be a scam. Messages from unknown numbers asking for money are usually malicious. Always confirm with your friend

via another communication method before acting. If someone whose number you don't recognise contacts you claiming to be a friend or family member, try calling the number and if nobody answers the call, send a message to their old number asking if it's them contacting you. Activate WhatsApp 2-step verification. Once enabled WhatsApp will send a verification code to your default device when someone tries to log in from another device.

If you believe you may have been scammed you can report it as follows:

Android: Open WhatsApp, hit More Options, and head to Settings>Help>Contact us to submit a scam report. IOS: Open WhatsApp, tap Settings>Help>Contact us

People pleasers find it hard to say 'no'

Anxiety specialist hypnotherapist David McGee has some tips to help overcome the need to gain the approval of others.

Many of us live our lives in constant fear of not being liked or accepted by others. This fear often leads to people pleasing behaviours where we sacrifice our own wants and needs trying to get the approval of others.

While this is a normal part of human behaviour, being overly concerned with what others think can be extremely harmful to our mental health and wellbeing. This behaviour is not sustainable in the long term and can lead to extreme feelings of anxiety, stress, and even depression.

Here are a few tips to help you overcome the fear of not being liked:

Identify your values and priorities

Take time to identify what is important to you and what you want to achieve in life. Once you have a clear understanding of that, it will be easier to make decisions that align with these beliefs. This will help you to live a more



authentic life, true to yourself, which in turn will attract people who appreciate and respect you for who you are.

Learn to say no

People pleasers often have a hard time saying no to others, even when it means sacrificing their own time, energy, and resources. Learning to say no is an important step in overcoming the fear of not being liked. Remember – it's okay to say no – it doesn't make you a bad person. You have the right to set boundaries and prioritise your own needs.

Practise self-care

This is an essential part of maintaining good mental health

and wellbeing. It's important to take care of yourself physically, emotionally, and mentally including getting enough sleep, eating a healthy diet, exercising regularly and doing things that bring you joy and fulfilment. In turn, you'll feel more confident and less concerned about what others think of you.

Surround yourself with positive people

This can have a huge impact on your self-esteem and confidence. It's important to be among people who support and encourage you, rather than those who bring you down. Look out for positive, likeminded individuals.

Practise self-compassion

Finally, it's important to practise self-compassion. You're only human, and it's okay to make mistakes and have flaws. Be kind to yourself and treat yourself with the same compassion and understanding that you would offer to a good friend. This way, you'll feel more comfortable being yourself and less concerned about what others think.

Remember that you are worthy of love and acceptance just the way you are, and you don't need to change yourself to gain the approval of others.

Help save a life – give blood

Every day thousands of people's lives are saved or improved thanks to the generosity of blood donors.

But sadly, there are still lots of patients can't be treated because there are not enough supplies. You can support the NHS by giving blood – there's an urgent need for regular donors. The blood you give is a lifeline in an emergency and for people who need long-term treatments. You or your family may be grateful to a blood donor one day. The NHS needs more than 5,000 blood donations every day to treat patients in need across England and, each year, it needs 135,000 new donors, as some can no longer give blood. Most people aged between 17 and 65 can donate. There is a particular need for 40,000 more black donors to meet the growing demand for better-matched blood and treat conditions such as sickle cell disease. Sickle cell is more prevalent in people of black heritage and ethnically matched blood provides the best treatment.

Take time to reflect on eternal life

Death and taxes – both very certain! But I'm only going to talk about death here – and please read at least a bit further before doing the very British thing and refusing to discuss the matter!

I have the awesome (in the original meaning of the word - filling me with awe) privilege of visiting families at their darkest hour. They open their homes and their lives to me by telling me stories of their loved ones – how they met and fell in love; or how the person who has died was as a parent, sibling, friend, and perhaps most heart-breaking of all, a child. I love to hear the stories and be with them in their grief - after all it's biblical to laugh with those who laugh, and mourn with those who mourn.

Some funerals have been meticulously planned by the loved one in advance – Bible reading(s), music, hymns, place. Sometimes they've even written their own eulogy. Others have got nothing at all for me to go on. I once took a funeral where the family had nothing to say about the person who had died. Perhaps they just couldn't deal with it. Various poems are often requested at funerals. One suggests "death is nothing at all". But of course it's something. Death is massive and heart-breaking and life changing for those who lose a loved one. And when we ourselves are facing death, it's also huge. We don't know how it will be, though the medical world has made it a lot easier than it was in the past. I want to remind us, always, as Christians, and as at this time of year we are heading towards Easter, we remember that with death we are facing eternal life with God. A new birth.
